FIRST LESSON Exodus 34:29-35

<sup>29</sup>Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. <sup>30</sup>When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. <sup>31</sup>But Moses called to them; and Aaron and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. <sup>32</sup>Afterward all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the Lord had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. <sup>33</sup>When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; <sup>34</sup>but whenever Moses went in before the Lord to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, <sup>35</sup>the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.



### SECOND LESSON

2 Corinthians 3:12--4:2

<sup>12</sup>Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, <sup>13</sup>not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. <sup>14</sup>But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. <sup>15</sup>Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; <sup>16</sup>but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. <sup>17</sup>Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. <sup>18</sup>And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

<sup>4:1</sup>Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. <sup>2</sup>We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.



And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

### PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION

Lord, we celebrate this final Sunday of Epiphany with great joy. And we are thankful that your divine manifestation has been revealed to us. Our celebration began by recalling the three wise men bearing gifts to you as an infant and recognizing you as the greatest among kings.

Our celebration closes with your transfiguration – the visit of Moses and Elijah recognizing you as the greatest among prophets, sent by the Father to reveal of his plan for Salvation.

### O, God of light, hear us, as we pray.

We have simple eyes and do not always recognize the ways you reveal yourself to us in our daily lives. We wait for some profound sign; for the heavens to open or the earth to move. Whether we are great or small, forgive us for our shortcomings and guide us to raise up the good in others as we strive to let your light shine through our own deeds.

### O, God of light, hear us, as we pray.

Around the world so many live under the threat of violence and oppression and deprivation.

Lord we pray for the children in Kiev and all those living under the shadow of war. We pray for the children of Mogadishu and all those who are persecuted for believing your promises. We pray for the children of Hong Kong and all those whose freedoms are being usurped.

We pray for the children of Glynn County, Georgia, and every place where children live in fear simply because of the color of their skin. We pray for children everywhere who go to bed hungry or who work long and dangerous hours in fields or factories.

Let your salvation and your justice fall like rain to parched souls here and around the world. Make us into the rivers and the lakes that channel your love to those who need it most.

### O, God of light, hear us, as we pray.

Jesus, our great healer, we also pray for our family and our community. For those who have suffered loss, make them feel whole. For those battling illness, bring them healing. For those who are caregivers, keep them safe and strong and reward their compassion.

Because there are so many who carry burdens that we can't see or don't understand, give us all a measure of your grace so that we can help to support them through their difficulties.

And we especially ask your divine outreach to those we now name aloud or in our hearts.

We look forward to the day when we can see you, Christ, gloriously transfigured in Heavenly light.

We boldly ask these things in the name of your Son and our Redeemer, Jesus, the one true Christ.

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### THE CHURCH YEAR

The Season of Epiphany



In the church, the **liturgical year** focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.

The **third season** of the church year is **Epiphany**. It extends from the Epiphany of Our Lord on January 6 until Ash Wednesday on March 2.

February 27 is the *Transfiguration of Our Lord*, the last Sunday after the Epiphany. On this day, we celebrate the moment that Christ was revealed as God's son to Peter, James, and John. Transfiguration Sunday stands in stark contrast to what takes place just a few days later: Ash Wednesday, the day of sorrow and repentance, which begins the somber season of Lent.

The changing **liturgical colors** in the sanctuary serve to adorn the worship space and to call attention to the nature of the season or festival being celebrated. The liturgical color for today is **white.**
