



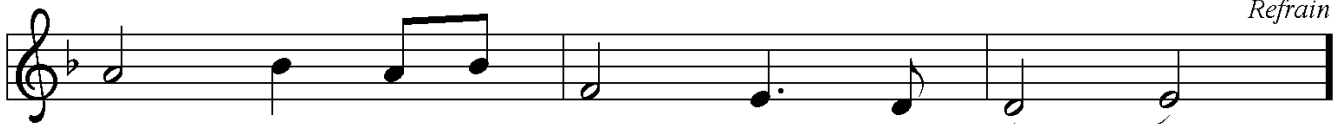

FIRST LESSON

Acts 2:1-21

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.” ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” ¹³But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.”

¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

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THE CHURCH YEAR

The Day of Pentecost

In the church, the liturgical year focuses on the life and ministry of Jesus. The changing seasons of the church year provide an opportunity to celebrate the Christian faith in worship. The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost.

The **sixth season** of the church year is **Pentecost**.

Today is the *Day of Pentecost* and it is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after the Resurrection. The word “pentecost” is derived from the Greek, meaning “fiftieth”.

Pentecost was originally an Old Testament festival called *Shavuot*. The apostles were celebrating this festival when the Holy Spirit descended upon them. The Holy Spirit sounded like a very strong wind, and it looked like tongues of fire. The apostles found themselves speaking in foreign languages, inspired by the Holy Spirit.

On this Day of Pentecost, we honor the Holy Spirit and the church’s mission in the world. The symbols of Pentecost are those of the Holy Spirit and include flames, wind, the breath of God, and a dove. The liturgical color for the day is red, symbolizing fire.
